Don Feder was a Boston Herald editorial writer and syndicated columnist from June 1983 to June 2002. For 19 years, his twice-weekly column appeared in New England's second largest newspaper. On February 28, 2002, the paper published his 2,000 th column.

His writings have also appeared in USA TODAY, The Washington Times, The Weekly Standard, National Review, American Enterprise, Front Page Magazine, Human Events, American Thinker and GrassTopsUSA. Feder has traveled extensively in Europe, the Caribbean, Latin America, Africa, and Asia.

Since leaving the Herald in 2002, Feder has served as a communications consultant and conference organizer for various pro-life and pro-family NGOs.

Feder worked with the World Congress of Families from 2006 to May 2018 as Communications Director, Coalitions Director and Coordinator of Regional Conferences. He spoke at Congresses in Geneva, Mexico City, Warsaw, Amsterdam, Madrid, Salt Lake City, Tbilisi and Budapest.

He also helped to organize and addressed regional conferences in Trinidad, Barbados, Antigua, St. Lucia, London, Paris, Belgrade, Chisinau, Moscow, Ulyanovsk, Riga, Lilongwe, Abuja, and Nairobi.
